

NON-PROFIT ADVANCEMENT INTERNSHIP

Internship Description: Partners for World Health is looking for undergraduates, graduate students or recent graduates who have excellent oral and written skills, are able to communicate effectively, are well organized, able to work independently, have a positive attitude, and enjoy collaborating with a team in a dynamic work environment.

The internship program is designed to provide students with an educational experience that complements their academic studies. Interns will have an opportunity to participate in the daily work and operations of a nonprofit from a development standpoint.

Responsibilities include:

1. Assisting in the cultivation and solicitation of major and planned gifts by coordinating with the President, Director of Operations, and Board of Directors under the direction of the Development and Communications Manager to manage a portfolio of 25-50 major or planned giving prospects.

- 3. Build, track, and support donation increases
- 4. Track communications with donors
- 5. Debrief with Staff and Committee Members
- 6. Assist in developing proposals
- 7. Create and support intimate cultivation events to steward prospects and donors
- 8. Assists in identifying Foundation Prospects, builds a calendar of Letter of Intent and

Solicitation due dates, research trustees and PWH board connections.
